Our prayer focus for May is on the Moore Community House in Biloxi, Mississippi. It is a non-profit mission agency of the United Methodist Church and supported by United Women in Faith. They serve East Biloxi and the Mississippi Gulf Coast. They were founded in 1924 by Rev. Waldo Moore and his wife, Myrtie. The community house was originally formed "so that working mothers would have a nursery in which to leave their children." By the 1950's they had established kindergarten classes, handicraft classes, library classes, supervised playground activities, and a meeting place for brownies and girl scouts. Today they offer childcare through an early Head Start program and job training for women in construction and advanced manufacturing. Along with their Head Start program, they provide early childhood and comprehensive health and family support services to low-income families, pregnant women, and infants and toddlers up to age three. Moore Community House has received a 4.6 star rating.

The Alabaster House was founded by the current director, Jennifer Magaha. Jennifer is a recovering heroin addict and a survivor of human trafficking. For over 15 years, she lived with an active addiction. Because of God's intervention in her life, Jennifer has now been sober since 2017. She has a passion for leading broken women toward redemption through Jesus Christ. They have just opened a 2nd house for the residential program. They are in need of all types of items for the new house. They need furniture, household items, linens, kitchen items, laundry baskets, cleaning supplies, etc. If you would like to make a donation of items to Alabaster House, you may place items in the basket located on the tables at the back of the sanctuary marked Alabaster House. If you have large items to donate, please contact the church office, so arrangements can be made. This collection will be in addition to our Meals on Wheels donations.


Meal for Berea Elementary Staff




