United Women Of Faith...Our prayer focus for March is on the Epworth Village in York, Nebraska. They are a Christ centered mission founded in 1889. Their mission statement reads "We believe all of God's people are of worth and value." They offer services to children, youth, and families who may feel left out, powerless, and needy. Their goal is to strengthen families to prevent abuse and neglect whenever possible. They are proud to be a recent National Mission Institute of the United Women in Faith. Three services they offer are 1. In home family services to educate young parents in their raising and teaching of their children. 2. A child care and enrichment center for ages six weeks to five years where social, emotional, cognitive, and physical development is achieved through games, music, stories, and art. 3. Foster care services for 24 nearby counties aimed at reducing trauma of separation from their own families.

Birthday cards will be sent to missionaries Esther Hunter in Ohio and Laura Kirby in North Carolina.

Outreach Ministries... The outreach ministries committee has selected United Ministries as our agency to support for the month of March. United Ministries stated that they are in need of rice, canned fruit and mixed vegetables. We have decided to give the church a challenge to collect 75 bags of rice and 75 cans of fruit. You can place the items on the mission table at the back of the sanctuary.

In addition to our congregation participating in this ministry, we are going to invite the children of the CDC to help with the ministry and bring rice and canned fruit to chapel weekly.

3:16 Prayer Ministry Begins

The prayer team is excited to announce a new component of the prayer ministry at Berea Friendship.

With its name taken from the familiar passage in the third chapter of John's Gospel, the **3:16 Ministry** will have both an "inward" and "outward" focus. We want to lift up those within our church family who are in need of special prayers, and we want to ask God's blessings as we prepare for our Attendance Crusade.

Our goal is for a minimum of **3 members** to pray for **16 minutes** during a designated time on a Tuesday morning. Certainly, more than 3 members may commit to come and pray; we just want to be sure we have at least three folks praying each Tuesday.

Here are the details:

- 3:16 Ministry begins Tuesday, February 28, and continues on each of the following Tuesdays;
- the sanctuary will be open each Tuesday morning from 10:30 until 11:30; those participating are asked to enter quietly from the side of church closest to the fellowship hall;
- multiple folks may be in prayer at the same time; 3 is the minimum number we hope to be present;
- a prayer guide will be placed on the altar with suggested topics for prayer; please feel free to add persons or concerns or events to the guide;
- at the end of your time of prayer, please leave the guide on the altar.

The Prayer Team will have additional initiatives supporting our Attendance Crusade. We hope this new component will strengthen our ministry to each other and prepare us for ministry to all of God's people.

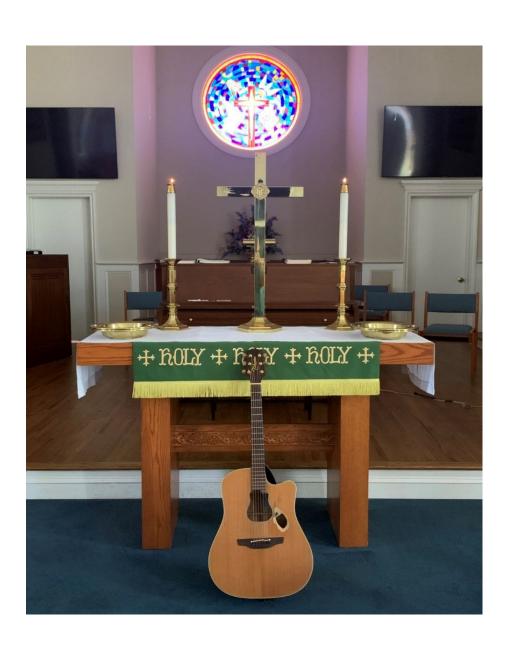

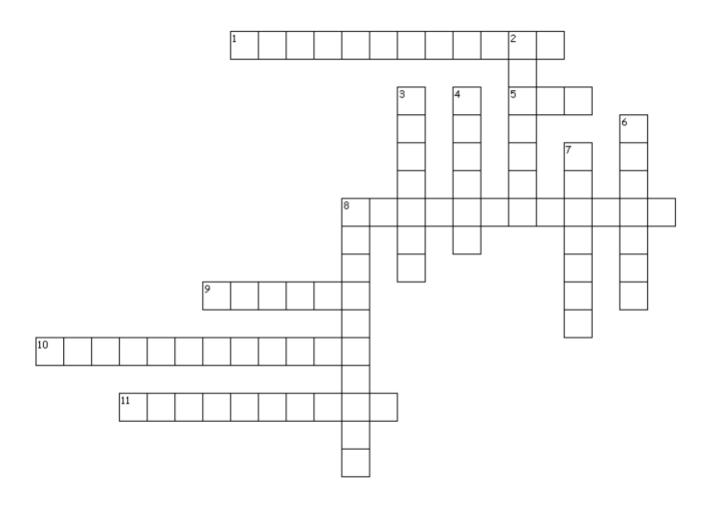
