We have four beautiful Gospels of good news Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. We tend to process stories of Jesus individually digesting the Gospel writers personal take on what was most important in given moments. When we take multiple Gospels, and glean from several viewpoints, we naturally get a more comprehensive picture. The comprehensive picture has been fascinating me more and more of late. When we process Jesus' ministry comprehensively, the timelines and details reveal something we don't talk about much. Nothing about Jesus' ministry was easy! He was always hard pressed by people and their personal needs. In every story we see Jesus meeting people in their need as they come to him. On other occasions Jesus seeks out individual people in their need. The world is always full of human brokenness to be healed. Nothing about Jesus' ministry was easy!

We are watching and studying "The Chosen" in Bible study on Monday nights. Given points in Jesus' ministry are taken and humanized in a fascinating way. We don't need to know more about humanity's humanity. The Chosen episodes reveal that humanity's story is always the same. People always try to process who God is and what he expects of us in physical human context. Our ways and our thinking are woefully deficient! The Chosen also reveals perspectives on something the church desperately needs. We are quick to worship God Almighty in heaven! And we are equally quick to neglect the message of Jesus' humanity, the message of God in flesh. I suggest to you the message of what God in flesh looks like is the message the church needs most of in every age.


