Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

I have a couple of topics to cover in this newsletter. First, I want to share some biblical truth concerning BFUMC's Attendance Crusade. Secondly, I want to announce times I will consistently be in the office.

Faith in God is not meant to be a passive, behind the scenes, flying under the radar kind of faith. Neither are we to be making ourselves the most visible, or the boldest loudest voices that are absolutely heard. We are to be witnesses of our faith in Jesus Christ. We are to operate humbly as Jesus did, laying our lives down. Study Philippians 2:1-11. The text tells how God in flesh ministered to the world effectively in His time. Now is our time BFUMC - we are to follow Jesus' lead. We are Jesus' stand-ins in the year 2023, making sure His story continues to be told and unfold.

All who came to Jesus had their needs met. Looking into His eye's, each person immediately felt unconditionally loved and accepted, and inspired to be more in His presence. United Women Of Faith... The UWF of Berea Friendship will have a special recognition bulletin for the special woman/young lady in our lives on Mother's Day, May 14th . Our prayer focus for April is on the Good Neighbor Settlement House in Brownsville, Texas. It was established in 1953 by the First United Methodist Church in Brownsville. It was created to provide basic services to the most needy communities. As Brownsville evolved, they now strive to meet the needs of a growing homeless population. Their mission statement reads "To give clients hope by offering a community of empowerment through providing meals, basic needs, outreach, and support services while creating a legacy of positive change for Brownsville." Four of their successful programs are: Client services that assist individuals or families in areas such as resume building, applying for benefits, case management, and job search. A hygiene program that provides hygiene kits and access to showers and laundry service. Medical services where a doctor and medical staff offer free consultations one day a week. A soup kitchen that provides three meals a day as well as snack bags. Most years they serve as many as 70,000 meals.

Outreach Ministries... The Outreach Ministries Committee has selected Jasmine Road as our agency to support for the month of April. They need Paper towels, toilet paper, and laundry detergent. You can place the items on the mission table at the back of the sanctuary. In addition to our congregation participating in this ministry, we are going to invite the children of the CDC to help with the ministry and bring rice and canned fruit to chapel weekly.

Jasmine Road is South Carolina's first two-year residential program for adult women survivors of human trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. Jasmine Road's mission is to provide a path to healing and employment for women survivors of sex trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. Our vision is that Jasmine Road will be known as a loving community that offers women opportunities to flourish, one life at a time. Jasmine Road is modeled after the very successful Thistle Farms non-profit which was founded in Nashville, Tennessee by Episcopal priest Becca Stevens more than 20 years ago. The Greenville affiliate was incorporated in 2016 as a result of a partnership between Christ Church Episcopal, Triune Mercy Center and Bon Secours, St. Francis Health System. When Jasmine Road's first safe house opened its doors in May 2018, it joined more than 40 Thistle Farms sister agencies around the country in

offering a transformative two-year residential program with an innovative social enterprise component, the first of its kind in Greenville. Thank you to everyone that donated to the collections of rice and canned fruits and other canned items for United Ministries. We exceeded our challenge again.
